# ICT

Using Information and Communication Technology (UCIT) is one of the three statutory cross-curricular skills of the Northern Ireland Curriculum. Throughout the school, ICT is integrated into the curriculum to support teaching and learning. All classes have the use of the latest technology in interactive whiteboards, computers, laptops and access to 20 new iPads. Our ICT suite has recently been refurbished to ensure children have access to a high quality and well-resourced computing area.

# PE

In our school we place great emphasis on the teaching of PE and sport, both within the normal curriculum and as an extra-curricular activity. Within our curriculum, each class is timetabled for PE taught by their class teacher or by a specialist coach. Currently we have Healthy Kidz, Tyrone GAA and IFA coaches taking PE across all classes.



# Religious Education

Religious Education will be available to all children at Laghey Primary School. The Religious Education of pupils will be accomplished in two equally important and complementary ways.

- Through the totality of experiences in the school
- Through the Religious Education programme

Staff are aware of the spiritual needs of the children and the important part Religious Education plays in a child's upbringing. The Grow in Love programme is the core resource for the teaching of RE, linking the home and school in the task of handing on the faith to the children.

Parents of children from a non-Catholic background can contact the school in relation to religious instruction for their child.

# Special Educational Needs

In order that every child realises his/her true potential at school, the teachers will ensure that the context of lessons are carefully matched to individual needs. Every effort will be made to provide maximum access to the curriculum for children with Special Educational Needs. Children with additional needs will be identified through teacher observation, assessment and performance in standardised tests. Parents will be made aware of any concerns as soon as possible. In accordance with the Code of Practice on the identification and Assessment of Special Educational Needs, the identified needs of each child will be catered for by his/her class teacher, who will be supported by relevant outside agencies such as peripatetic service provided by the EA, and support within the school where appropriate. The Special Needs Co-ordinator is responsible for SEN provision, ensuring relevant plans are drawn up for every child who has been identified as SEN.

# Assessment and Reporting

Detailed monitoring of pupils' progress takes place throughout the school year, both formally and informally. This information is discussed with parents at parent/teacher meetings at the end of autumn term. An end of year report will be issued in June. Parents are encouraged to play an active role in their child's education and appointments can be made to discuss progress with the class teacher at any mutually agreed time.



# Homework

The school recognises the importance of parental support in the education of our children. Homework is an integral part of every pupil's learning and an opportunity for parents to become involved in their children's learning and progress. It reinforces the learning done in school and is an excellent home/school link.



# Extra-Curricular Activities

In Laghey Primary School we are aware of the importance of visits and other enrichment activities in the development of our children. These form a key part of the children's education and are usually closely linked to class topics.

Extra-curricular activities add a valuable dimension to the education of children. We join with quality external groups to provide a wide range of sporting and creative activities. At different times this will include:

# Parental Involvement

Our school has a strong, hard-working and enthusiastic team of parents who sit on the Parent-Teacher Association. They organise various fundraising and social events throughout the year. Money raised by these events has been put to purchasing an outside classroom, a trim trail for the playground and the Accelerated Reader programme.



# Pupil Voice

Pupils are given a voice through both the Eco-Council and School Council that is elected annually with representatives from each class.

Representatives meet on a regular basis to discuss and put plans in place to help with improvements within the school.
